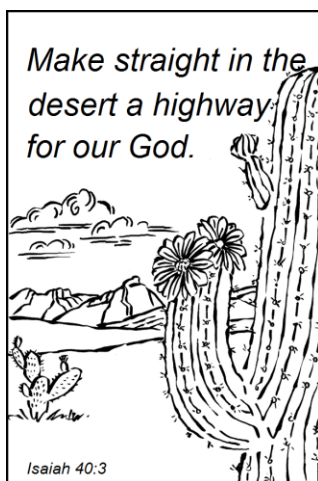

An Invitation to Confirmation Class 2012, Grades 8 through 12

Confirmation refers to the decision to personally respond to God's grace with intentional commitment. If the confirmands have not been baptized we will give him or her the opportunity to be baptized on Palm Sunday, April 1st. Confirmation will also be on Sunday, April 1st. Through confirmation class, youths may become members of The Church at Litchfield Park. Because this class is open to the community, this is optional. Some highlights of the class include:

- A biblical study of God, the Bible and what it means to be a Christian.
- How does one personally respond to God's grace?
- What does it mean to be a member of the church?
- A study of the meaning of baptism, the Lord's Supper, and the traditions of the church.
- An opportunity to be baptized and to become a member of The Church at Litchfield Park.

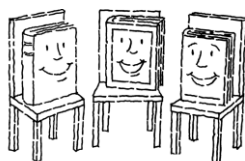

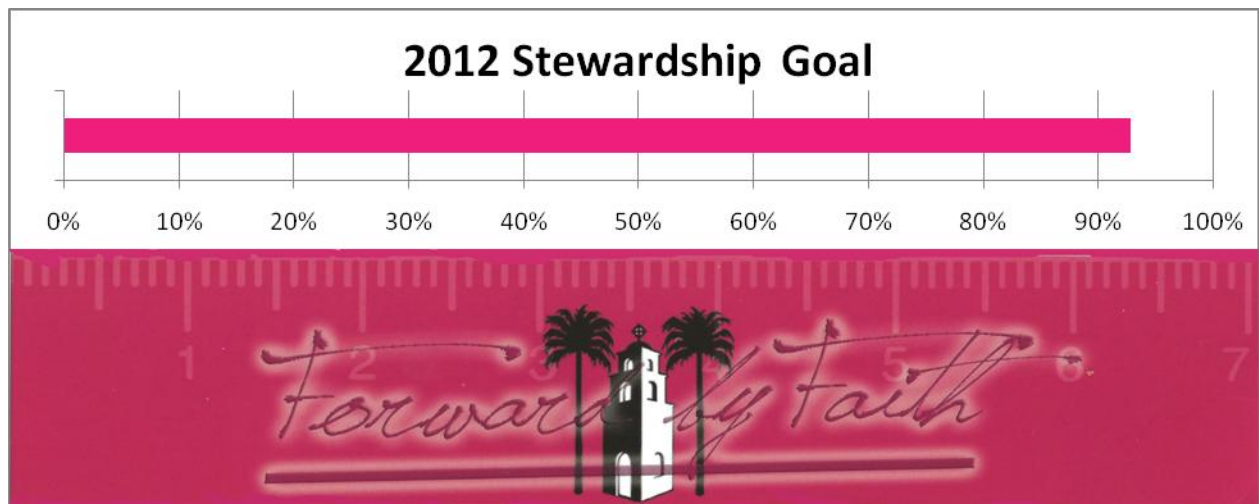
